The brief
Develop a corporate spokesperson Character (IT) for a large corporate entity - that in its application will have 3D, 4d and 6d, high and low resolution manifests.

A design in the 'seed' for propagating IT - plus the product's client background you are able to develop from. Each design represents the positioning and premium benefits of a specific product in a word based manifesto. Eg IF YOU BREAK AND DRIVE YOU'RE A BLOODY IDIOT (TAC).

WEEK 1 WORKSHOP - TURNING WORDS INTO IDEAS

Starting with three slogans each - in groups of (3) deconstruct each of the group members' slogans - it's a meaning, and what its meaning might be for a specific target market. How does the world (wide web) perceive 'humaneness'? By WEEK 2 post a single available 720p jpg of examples of anthropomorphism from any source and post on the Bb Human news Discussion Board. Criteria for inclusion to be innovation rather than simply aesthetic familiarity - solutions that demonstrate the coding of anthropomorphism.

Concept Briefing Develop multiple alternative visualisations of the entity behind your words, as sketches. Post them on Bb in the Concept Discussion Board for group discussion. WEEK 3. Present in workshop/lecture critiques
